Plan of Work:

January – March

Recruit teachers and agency hosts to join Pull Your Share, form partnership groups

April – Mid May

Coordination with partnership groups

In-class noxious weed/ Pull Your Share lessons

Last two weeks of May – 15 plus Pull Your Share educational weed pulls
